

From the Mayor

On the 7th May the Town Councillors voted me in as Mayor for a second year of office. I would like to take this opportunity to thank them for having the confidence in me in this role. It is an honour and a privilege to serve as Mayor of this beautiful historic town. In May 2025 there will be local Council elections in

Cornwall. In the 2021 elections not enough residents stood for election as Town Councillors. As a consequence, Lostwithiel Town Council does not currently hold the General Power of Competence. This is an important power as it gives your Council the power 'to do anything that individuals generally may do' as long as they don't break other laws. As Lostwithiel has 16 Council seats to be eligible to use this power the Council needs 11 Councillors to be elected at the May 2025 elections. We do hope that more residents will want to stand for Council next year, if you are interested, please do speak to any of the current Councillors. We currently have one Councillor vacancy albeit it only until May 2025, please do contact any Town Councillor or the Council office to discuss what is involved.

I thought it would be nice to give you a general taste of what the role of a Mayor entails. It's not just about chairing the monthly Council meetings which is obviously very important, there is so much more to it.

As Mayor you have the opportunity to attend many events/meetings to promote Lostwithiel. This includes Mayor Making/Civic services at other Towns around our county. A favourite event in my diary is the High Sheriff's Annual Garden Party, this is an opportunity to meet so many different people, to promote our town and to listen to the experiences of other towns and communities. Just last year a number of Cornish Mayors set up a group which met mostly via zoom where discussions were had regarding concerns common to a number of towns which everyone felt was really beneficial.

Cornwall Council split Cornwall into 12 Community Area Partnerships, Lostwithiel is a member of Cornwall South which is one of the largest areas covering from Braddock down to St Ewe. This gives a partnership focus and the opportunity to set up Community Priority Action Plans tailored to the communities which make up the CAP. Recent meetings for example have covered housing & environmental issues.

Many residents are under the misapprehension that as Mayor I can make decisions on behalf of the Council. The role is to act as a figurehead, 'the first amongst equals' the Council as a corporate body makes the decisions so do, please come along to a Council meeting. Usually, they are held on the first Tuesday monthly in Lostwithiel Library and start at 7pm.

I would like to remind people that we are volunteers too. On 16th May the Lostwithiel Annual Town Meeting was held at the Community Centre. The meeting was well attended and a number of organisations gave an overview of the past year events and future projects.

Lostfest was once again a great success the weather helping of course. So many people using the trains which was so good to see. Thank you to everyone.

Finally, can I please mention that the 80th D Day Commemorations are approaching. On 2nd June there will be a Civic service at the Church and on 4th June a Concert held in St Barts starting at 7pm. On Thursday 6th June the D-Day 80 Proclamation will take place down by the War Memorial on the Parade at 8am. In the evening at 21.15hrs Lostwithiel will participate in the International Tribute. We hope that a number of residents will be able to attend.



The River Fowey at Lostwithiel

Hooray! There are 27 new designated bathing sites in England announce this

week, of which the nearest to us is the River Dart in Devon. So, what does that mean? Well, it doesn't mean that the sites are any safer for swimming and other water activities. But it does mean that the water is checked for bacteria on a regular basis by the Environment Agency. This at least gives people a chance of knowing the risks and gives us ammunition with which to berate the water company and persuade them to clean up their act. So, what about our River Fowey here in Lostwithiel? This has been a source of pleasure and enjoyment available to everyone free of charge for a considerable time and hopefully for years to come.

The condition of the river affects a whole range of people; children and adults who swim here, paddle borders, canoeists, fisherman, dog walkers who dogs inevitably end up in the water. Even those of us who eat chips and drink wine on the tables by 'the beach', and this spot is also a particular focal point for many local events and activities.

There has been increased interest in the condition of our rivers lately with high profile celebrities and events like the Oxford and Cambridge boat race drawing attention to the state of our rivers. The BBC and national newspapers have also been highlighting the problem.

We all know it's time the water companies are held to account for their lack of investment and their apparent policy of putting profits before people and planet.

Lostwithiel Environment Action Forum (LEAF) are currently engaging with the relevant authorities to seek designated bathing status for the River Fowey at the site just below the bridge with support and advice from other more experienced and knowledgeable environmental groups. The river is a major asset to our town, and we hope you will agree and support our efforts to protect the river and the wildlife which depends on it and the pleasure it gives to us all.







Fowey RNLI

On March 29 the coastguard requested that the Fowey lifeboat launch at 4.40pm to



assist with the rescue of a dog that had fallen from the cliffs near Port Mellon and become stranded on the rocks below. Due to the prevailing wind and sea conditions, it was decided that our all-weather lifeboat should attend rather than the inshore. Mevagissey Coastguard were in attendance at the top of the cliffs but were unable to reach the dog. Once on scene Fowey lifeboat crew prepared the inflatable XP boat that is carried



onboard the all-weather lifeboat and launched. Crew members Callum Pritchard and Amelia Luck took the XP boat ashore to the base of the cliffs where they were greeted by a friendly Bob the dog. Thankfully he was uninjured. Callum and Amelia took Bob to Port Mellon beach where he was handed over to the waiting coastguard team and safely reunited with his owner.

Congratulations to Luke 'Boris' Watts who has passed out as a qualified D class helm at Fowey lifeboat station. Boris said: 'I was nervous before the final assessments but once completed I was very pleased with the outcome. Now looking forward to taking all that I've learnt so far and putting it into real life shouts, saving people at sea and keeping the crew and boat safe.' Weekly RNLI training exercises focus on teamwork, technical competence and safe operating procedures covering everything from boat-handling, search and rescue, and navigation, to radar training, radio communications and casualty care. Much of the training is scenario-based with one of the station's LTA's, allowing crew to work through the processes as a team to ensure the best outcome. Training can also involve exercises with the Coastguard Rescue Helicopter and training courses at the RNLI lifeboat college in Poole.

With a top speed of 25 knots, Fowey's D class lifeboat can endure 3 hours at sea at this speed on search and rescue missions – a crucial factor when lives are at risk. The inshore lifeboat can access areas inaccessible to Fowey's all-weather lifeboat, such as close to cliffs, rocks and inside caves and it will be Boris's job to make sure everyone who goes out to sea returns to shore safely. Fowey Coxswain, Jonathan Pritchard said: 'Boris is a very enthusiastic and active member of the Fowey lifeboat crew. He has personally attended 207 afloat training exercises and 54 lifeboat launches, clocking up a total of over 702 volunteer hours during this time. If something needs doing at the station he is always one of the first to volunteer to help. Boris has worked very hard to complete his training and I, along with everyone at the station would like to congratulate him on his achievement as a fully passed out D class helm.'

My Lostwithiel

The 80th Anniversary Of D-Day On June 6th 2024

As we approach the 80th Anniversary of D-Day on June 6th we remember the men and women of this town who, on active service, were part of this historical event.

This town during WW2 hosted thousands of troops from the U.S.A. billeted in the Old Grammar School and Boconnoc with their laundry on the Quay, the Spaniards in the Kings Arms Long Room and the Dutch Javanese at Pill Farm whilst other troops were housed in the Band Room in Quay Street and at Lanwithan House. Italian POWs were at a camp near St Nectan Church and the German POWs were sent to work on various farms, some in this area. Much ammunition was stored in the surrounding areas of Lostwithiel with army lorries and troops continuously on the move.

The town was alive, the public houses were well attended, dances were held in the Drill Hall and Church Rooms with films at the Glyn Cinema in South Street, having recently opened in 1937. Having been born after D-Day and brought up in Quay Street where my grandfather and father were family butchers I remember how mum used to recall the war years.

Mum married dad in 1940 and as a childless couple she may have been assigned to an ammunition factory 'up country'. Dad working in the food industry would have been exempt from active service but he chose to 'join up' to keep mum at home and to do his bit for King and Country. Granddad employed a local butcher/ slaughterman to assist in the business in dad's absence for the heavy work which enabled mum to work in the shop. In those days the butchers slaughtered their own meat and our family operated from the slaughter house in Quay Street now Palace Printers and the Art Gallery. Life went on from day to day with all the movements associated with war then one day mum said she woke up and the town was silent, all the troops had gone but for what reason no one knew at the time. In those days communications were sparse compared to today. Letters were infrequent and most people relied on the wireless (radio) and newspapers or cinema newsreel as their only means of knowing events in other parts of the world.

One happy family event did occur when my maternal grandmother's American nephew arrived unexpectedly on the doorstep. Dick was posted to Europe with the American army and paid an unexpected visit, such a surprise and delight to all the family as in those days when a family member emigrated the chances were you never saw them or their family again.

Dad joined the Royal Artillery but spoke little of his war service except to say that he was part of the D-Day Campaign on active service at Pegasus Bridge and he always held strong memories of the terrible death and devastation in Caen. Also he did recall that the Normandy beaches were heavily mined and at any moment the lorries would hit a mine and lives were lost, but the troops had to keep driving and hope for the best. Little else was ever mentioned of the war. His family, primarily, were quite unaware that he was at D-Day. Thankfully dad survived but unfortunately, so many did not. Dad returned home in April 1945 with a posting to Asia imminent, then on May 8th Victory in Europe, VE Day, was announced so fortunately his war service ended and three months later on August 15th with Victory in Japan, VJ Day, WW2 ended.


Many Lostwithiel men were part of the D-Day Campaign which lasted until 24th July and during my research I found that Harold Tucker and Herbert Wilton both names on the Boconnoc War Memorial lost their lives during this campaign. We remember them and their families and all from this town and the nation who did not return home. My classmates as a result of the war grew up without their father.

My mother for as long as I can remember, each year, acknowledged the anniversary of D-Day and ironically it was the day she was laid to rest five years ago.


