

From the Mayor

Another year over and a new one just begun. I wish you all health and happiness for the year 2025. Dickensian, Lantern Parade and the Giants were all a great success as they are every year so thank you to all involved. Also, a big thank you to Rotary for organising the annual Christmas tree in the parade as well as Rev Sheila for the spectacular

arrangements of festive trees in the Church. During the Christmas period I visited both Cowbridge and Meadowbrook nursing homes a truly humbling experience with conversations never running dry. all having a different story to tell. I also attended the St Winnow outdoor Christmas Carol Service. I promised to keep you updated on the Edgcumbe House and Guildhall projects. Works are nearing completion; we have experienced a few hiccups along the way but we are getting there and we hope you will all be pleased with the results. The next step is a big launch day, dates and times to be finalized. As some of you will already be aware there is also a project to develop the long term vision for these historic buildings. Thank you to everyone who attended the consultation event in the Mayor's Parlour at Dickensian evening. Poynton Bradbury recorded 110 people attending which is absolutely fantastic. This consultation was to enable you to have your say on how we take this project forward and as Mayor I'm very grateful to everyone that attended and completed the feedback forms available. It was very much appreciated. Towards the end of last year, the Lostwithiel Veterans club unveiled a new set of military statues next to the War Memorial on the Parade in the heart of the town. This project serves as a poignant tribute to the men and women of HM Armed Forces whose bravery and sacrifice shaped the course of history. These striking silhouettes aim to bring life to personnel who paid the ultimate sacrifice. This project is a result of 2 years of dedicated fund raising by the Veterans club as well as generous contributions from local businesses. By the time this newsletter article is available the Council will have agreed it's 2025/2026 budget. This year the Town Council element of your Council Tax bill will stay the same so a Band D property will pay £231.39. Or This year the Town Council element of your Council Tax bill will increase by 2.01% so a Band D property will pay £236.05 which is an annual increase of £4.66 I try to visit as many residents with milestone Birthdays as possible. In December two past Mayors Gill Parsons, Karen Ross & myself visited Mrs Molly Pearce who celebrated her 100th birthday. This lady for many years volunteered in and around the town supporting a number of different organisations. Carnival week was her favourite time of all organising the children's tea party which consisted of a saffron bun and a glass of squash. Thinking back, I remember those buns being huge!!! Every year Molly would decorate her bay window in Fore Street with the poppy wreaths. Finally, a local resident has asked me to bring to your attention some anti social behaviour going on in the Town by a small number of youths (13/14/15 year in age) who went on a rampage last Friday 24th January in the early evening causing deliberate damage to a number of front doors. Several residents are affected and are very unhappy. Essentially, the youths in question, attack doors by delivering very hard kicks and filming the event for posting on social media. Then run off or head off on the bikes. The effect of their actions is many fold: 1. Emotional distress to occupants from the sudden very loud sounds inside when the assault is underway. 2. The unexpected financial impact and distress which in some cases could be significant to repair or replace part or all of the affected door. 3. Uncertainty as to whether any further behaviour like this or similar, will occur again. Devon and Cornwall Police have been contacted and have logged the incident, however they need more evidence to aid their enquiries. Residents of this town must know who these children are. It would be really helpful if you could please highlight this to both the Town Council, Community Police Laision officer, and add to your monthly column in the towns newsletter. There are many different residents, some more vulnerable than others. No one deserves this behaviour. Our local Tri-star officer has been notified.



Happy New Year to One and All.

Our South East Cornwall Labour MP, Anna Gelderd, attended our recent members' meeting to update us on some of her recent activity.

Anna recently visited Lostwithiel Surgery to see at first hand how they manage to provide such an excellent service, richly deserving their rating as the best surgery in Cornwall.

Anna has this week announced more good news on the health front; Cornwall is to get its Women's and Children's Hospital, and Derriford has made it into the priority group of the New Hospital Fund.

Recently it was Anna's turn to have lunch with the Prime Minister; this tradition gives backbench MPs a rare opportunity to discuss issues affecting their specific constituency. Anna used this opportunity to discuss feedback from her constituents about the proposed changes to farming inheritance tax.

Anna has set up her team of caseworkers and now has an admin office in the Liskeard area, where the day to day office work, and meetings take place. This month she will also be launching her roving, public facing, constituency 'office'. In addition to her regular surgeries, members of Anna's team will open a 'pop up' office in locations around the constituency. Lostwithiel will get a significant number of such visits a year which will ensure that constituents have far greater access to their MP than ever before.

Interviews for prospective Cornwall Councillors have been completed and I'm delighted to announce that Annette Lee Julian has been selected as Labour candidate for Lostwithiel. Annette lives in Liskeard where she has served on the town council for a number of years. This experience has inspired her to seek to represent part of her local area on Cornwall Council.

Labour South West Regional Conference is taking place in Plymouth on Feb 15th and 16th – Cabinet members, Wes Streeting MP, Darren Jones MP and Peter Kyle MP will be attending.



We're recruiting for volunteers to join our lifeboat crew in Fowey. Being a lifeboat crew member is one of the most exciting and fulfilling volunteer roles you could do. The RNLI is an inclusive organisation, providing first class equipment, training, guidance and support. This is a great chance to learn new skills, gain experience and make some great new friends as well. No previous nautical knowledge or skills are needed, as all crew must undergo a full RNLI training programme. We aim to launch within 13 minutes on a shout, so you'll need to live or work in Fowey. We particularly need people who are available during the day. You need to be be over 18 years old and be under 55 years old (inshore lifeboat crew) or under 65 (all-weather lifeboat crew). You'll need to be physically fit and to complete a health assessment. We also need shore crew, especially for the daytime. Shore crew help to get the boat ready to launch and then clean it down and make ready for service after a shout.
