From the Mayor



This is my final column as Mayor of Lostwithiel it has been both an honour and a privilege. On Friday 14 March we enter the pre-election period so there will be no Mayor's Column in next month's newsletter.

One of my final tasks as your Mayor will be to re-open Edgcumbe House and the Guildhall

on Saturday 08 March. Both buildings will be open 10.30-12 for invited guests, then 12.30-2 for the public to come a view, I do hope everyone will come along to take a look. On a personal level I would like to extend my thanks to all Councillors, the CLUP Committee and the Council staff that have put in hours and hours of their time to make this dream a reality. We are also very grateful to the project stakeholders who gave up their time to attend stakeholder consultation events and to all members of the public who attended the public consultation event held on Dickensian Evening some of the suggestions put forward at these meetings have been incorporated into this re-opening as well as the long term vision. The Council has also been supported by local organisations and businesses who have been very generous with their time, advice and recommendations.

In February I have represented Lostwithiel at Truro and participated in a discussion to relaunch the Elliott Foundation Trust, I've also attended Launceston Town Council's Civic service with Deputy Mayor Guiterman & Mrs Guiterman. I have been a guest at Lostwithiel Rotary's Annual President's night where two Rotarians John Brumby & Clive Littleton were presented with the Paul Harris Fellowship award and I've visited Lostwithiel residents with milestone birthdays, Mrs Enid Couch, Mrs Gwen Taylor & Mr Peter Best, cards and gifts were enjoyed by all.

Unfortunately a more negative note for those of you not on social media there has been another incident where a door to a residential property has been damaged. This happened on 16 February and the offenders threw a traffic bollard at the door and ran off. The incident has been reported to the Police. The Council's Public Toilet has recently re-opened following vandalism which cost £896 in repairs this vandalism has been reported to the Police.

Finally, just a few words regarding the forthcoming Town Council election. Cornwall Council is the election authority and will administer and call the local elections. The Notice of Election will be issued on Friday 14 March, from this date, it will be possible to download candidate packs from Cornwall Council's website. All nomination papers must be submitted in person by the candidate or their representative at a Cornwall Council designated elections office no later than 4pm on Wednesday 02 April. Cornwall Councillor elections are also being held at the same time.

Please do consider standing as a Cornwall Councillor or Lostwithiel Town Councillor and help to make a difference.

The middle upstairs room a load bearing beam which was rotten and needed replacing with metal RSJs. All this incurred extra expense.

We still need to continue to raise funds to start the next phase, grants are being sourced to help with this. The people of Lostwithiel have shown their support for this much-loved iconic building. If you would like to donate, please drop into the club or speak with Rev Sheila.



. **SPECIAL TRIBUTES:** It is with great sadness that we record the recent deaths of Tremar Menendez and John Smith, both of whom were volunteers and Friends of Lostwithiel Museum Association. Their individual contributions towards the success of the museum are widely appreciated by those who follow.

We send our sincere condolences to the families and friends of Tremar and John.

Tremar Menendez became involved with Lostwithiel Museum when Sally Whiffing volunteered as the first professional Curator. During this time Tremar learnt much about curatorial procedure and was therefore able to take over as Honorary Curator when Sally left for Dorset in 1997. It was 20 years later that Tremar 'handed over the curatorial keys' having achieved the status of Lostwithiel Museum's longest serving curator. During those years Tremar also volunteered as a Museum Steward, a Town Heritage Walks Guide, a LMA Committee member and a Trustee. Continuing to support all our museum ventures, Tremar will be remembered for his strict attention to detail, his passionate interest in all things to do with Lostwithiel and its history, his friendship, loyalty and steadfastness.

John Smith first joined Lostwithiel Museum as a Museum Steward before taking over the exacting role of Treasurer from David Smith in 2017 — a position he conducted most ably. It was largely due to John's encouragement that the museum got involved in the Gift Aid Scheme we have continued to financially benefit from. As a LMA Committee member and Trustee, John was always willing to be involved in activities 'behind the scenes' and keen to support other volunteers with their endeavours. It was sad to see John leave Cornwall in 2021 to be closer to family in Hampshire.

Crafting involves using your hands and your brain – helping to keep you active

Better sleep

It has been shown that the frequently repetitive nature of crafting can help us switch off at the end of the day and can enable us to have a better nights sleep.



In the first shout of 2025 for Fowey lifeboat volunteers, on Sunday 19 January as the crew



were recovering the D class after their regular Sunday morning training session at 12pm, a canoeist came alongside under the davit. They requested help for a fellow canoeist who was stuck between the tug and the tug barge west of Penmarlam opposite Jetty 5 and 6. This was potentially a very dangerous position with a strong ebb tide running. The Launch Authority decided to relaunch the D class immediately and advised Falmouth Coast-guard that we were self-launching at 12.03pm to the incident. The lifeboat crew arrived on scene at 12.10pm to find the canoeist had managed to extricate herself from the situation and was safely on the nearby beach. The crew proceeded to her position to check that she was alright, and it was ascertained that all was well. She was part of a group of canoeists from Golant and would be returning there. Safety advice was given.



On return from their second shout of the week Fowey crew were lucky enough to be accompanied by dolphins. Fowey's lifeboat volunteers had been tasked to launch their D class at 3.15 on Wednesday 22 January, as a member of the public had reported seeing an apparently unmanned blue inflatable kayak near the cliffs in the Carlyon Bay area. Once on scene an extensive shoreline and inshore search was conducted with no sign of the kayak. St Austell Coastguard were also in attendance. At 4pm, after a rendezvous with the coastguard team the crew were stood down The incident was considered to be a false alarm with good intent.

At 01:25 on Sunday February 16, Falmouth coastguard received a May Day from a vessel saying it was 4 miles from St Austell and taking on water. Falmouth coast guard requested Fowey to launch the all-weather lifeboat. Information from the coastguard was minimal due to electrical issues on the boat and systems not working. They ascertained that there was a person on a 27' sailing yacht, the location established from the boats' cell phone as being 1.5 miles SW west of the Gribbin, close to a ship at anchor. At 02:00 Fowey crew located the yacht and put two crew in dry suits on board to assess the damage.

There was now 300mm of water above the floor, and the salvage pump was transferred to the yacht and the crew managed to stabilise the situation. The crew established that the leak was caused by the headsail furling line getting wrapped round the prop and ripping the P bracket on the hull causing the boat to start taking on water. It was decided that the safest solution was to tow the vessel into Fowey leaving the crew and pump on board.

Permission was granted from Fowey Harbour Master for the boat to enter port. The coastguard team met the boat and took the casualty off to get warm and to be checked over. The crew maintained the water level, while the Launch Authority arranged for the boat to be lifted out by Toms yard. The boat was lifted by 05:24. This was a complicated shout, but a great team response from crew, the coastguard, Toms and Fowey Harbour Commissioners.

Paul joined as a volunteer crew member in 2022. He has since attended 16 shouts and 68 crew exercises, with 218 hours at sea.

We are running a lifejacket clinic, flare disposal and water safety day on Saturday March 29 from 11-3pm at the lifeboat station. At one of our previous clinics a team carried out safety checks on 169 lifejackets. Over 50% needed a critical safety part replacing, meaning that had they been used in an emergency, they may not have worked and could potentially have caused loss of life. 11 lifejackets were condemned outright as being unfit for use.

A further 51 needed new capsules, and 26 required replacement cylinders. The RNLI water safety team will help you to check your lifejacket to keep it safe and fully functioning and will show you how to check for wear and tear and defects. They will also show you how to carry out simple maintenance checks and will advise on parts you need to replace.

TMS will be there selling replacement parts. HM Coastguard has stopped disposing of expired or redundant flares handed in by private individuals. You now need to use a third-party service to dispose of flares. You may be breaking the law if you do not make sure flares are disposed of safely, to prevent any risk to other people or property. You can bring along your old out-ofdate flares to have them safely disposed of.

Please visit our Facebook page for full flare disposal terms and conditions. The RNLI team will be there all day running water safety sessions and refreshments will be available.


